


1. Gateway Cities matter

- Renewed market for urban living



3. But they face many complex and interrelated challenges


- Industrial change sparked a cycle of disinvestment




Unemployment Rate, 2008 - 2011





Percent of Population Poor or Working Poor



Percent of Residents Age 25+ with Bachelor's Degree










Percent of High School Graduates Planning to Attend a 2- or 4-Year College





Percent Change in Non-School Aid, FY2009 - FY2012




