Rebecca Davis is the Chief Operating Officer of the Massachusetts Competitive Partnership (MACP), where she oversees strategy, external affairs, and operations to advance innovation, social justice, economic mobility, and competitiveness across the Commonwealth. She also leads MACP's state and federal policy portfolios.

Davis currently serves on the Healey-Driscoll Administration's Energy Transformation Advisory Council and DRIVE Acceleration Team, and previously served on the Administration's Transportation Financing Task Force. She is also Co-Chair of the Mass Mobility Hub, a public-private initiative advancing next-generation mobility solutions in Massachusetts.

Before joining MACP, Davis was Deputy Director of the Metropolitan Area Planning Council (MAPC), where she guided organizational strategy, operations, and major initiatives in climate, public health, housing, transportation funding, and energy. She founded MAPC's Clean Energy Division, leading renewable energy and efficiency projects and championing policy advocacy for state and federal legislation.

Earlier in her career, Davis served as Legislative Director to State Senator Robert O'Leary, playing a key role in landmark environmental legislation, including the Massachusetts Oceans Act and Green Communities Act. She has also managed political campaigns and served on numerous influential boards and commissions, including Governor Baker's Future of Transportation Commission and the Energy Efficiency Advisory Council.

A graduate of Brown University with a degree in Public Policy, Davis is a proven leader dedicated to advancing impactful public policy, sustainability, and innovation.
